ideas from fellow members, on staying both physically and mental healthy – including yoga and meditation.



News from Jacobsen Industries.....and the Covid19 virus.....

Why are our employees still working, why are we still open? What are we doing that qualifies us as an 'essential' business?

We used to make millions of OEM auto parts. Those

orders have dwindled to 'zero'. How to help and feel like we are contributing? The US gov and others were quick to give us guidance a couple months ago.

We now make the wipes that are alcohol impregnated, and are dispensed using

a vertical dispenser stand common in clinics and hospitals, also now found at the entrance of many storefronts, also called shopping cart wipes, dispensed from the center of the roll vertically. These are the wipes no one thinks about, but are essential as they stop the contamination from one cart to another. Each roll has 1200 6" x 4" alcohol wipes. We make hundreds of rolls in a 24-hour day.

We are working 24/7...around the clock. That is multiple millions of alcohol wipes per day....and we are teaching and working with former competitors to increase that amount significantly. Below is a pic showing the use for these wipes located outside the

entrances of stores, clinics, hospitals and other open places.....

Rolls of wipes that are not a 1200 count are considered scrap by the gov, but for us, nothing goes to waste. Those thousands of wipes that are still good, just shorter rolls, are donated to the County clinics, where they add the alcohol.



On another note, right now, in our warehouse, there is enough filter material to make 1 million face masks, and 100,000 tear off face shield masks. On the former, I could make 10,000 a day, the latter, also

10,000 per day. However, the Mr. Pillow guy is making 150,000 of the masks per day, 3M and the auto companies are making millions, so we do what we can do best, with the folk on hand, and let Mr.

Pillow do his thing....

Update on the clear plastic face shields..... others have reached out and we are now working together with another firm, making many of the foam components that seal around the face, large quantities of them, while the other firm does the final assembly....presses are stamping them out as you read this.....We also now make the aluminum

nose stiffeners that are held on with self-sticking 3M adhesive. These go on the higher level N95 masks.

Safety? Wayne county demands that we check the temp of each employee prior to entering the building for each shift, ditto for truck drivers like the UPS and FedEx lads.

I am helping to run the show from my Belden Garage, while working on an XK120 Jaguar that needs lots of bodywork, mostly welding, which is fun stuff to do. A wooden fixture is now done to help align all the body panels, located in front of the green Lotus, in the pic below.... The real heroes are our employees....I just stay out of the way....:

Money is flowing out like a river, out of 100 or so folk,

only 16 are needed to make the wipes and foam face shield parts. The rest are laid off at 70% pay. That won't last



long. Time to investigate if the govt can give us some grants for doing this work.....Chase Bank has reached out and is helping with the govt. paperwork....

Again, we will overcome..... our employees have the right attitude, all of them working all hours to emerge



Not all museums are available for virtual tours (if there are no blue circles, zoom in further, if still no blue circles, it is not available). We enjoyed viewing the following museums: **Lamborghini Museum** in Sant' Agata, Italy, **Lane Museum** in Nashville, Tennessee, **Porsche Museum** in Stuttgart, Germany, **Coventry Transport Museum** in Coventry, UK.

For some museums, you can virtually walk through, other museums you can stand in one place and turn around 360 degrees. Click on a different blue circle to see another area of the museum.

3. The Gilmore Museum Virtual Car Show:

The museum solicited pictures from owners and collectors and has already received thousands! It's an amazingly varied collection of photos of cars and trucks from all through the 20th century. Look for some JAGM members cars! Go to GilmoreCarMuseum.org and click on the virtual car show image.

4. For lots of interesting virtual opportunities, go to **Google Arts and Culture** <u>artsandculture.google.com/partner</u>. You can tour many famous museums, buildings and sites, see the works of famous artists, tour the Louvre, the Taj Mahal, and Hubbel Space Center among others.

Reaching Jaguar 1906-7; cast 1926

Anna Hyatt Huntington American Huntington was one of the most prominent animal sculptors of the early twentieth century, celebrated for her keen powers of observation. "Reaching Jaguar" and its companion piece, "Jaguar", were based on Huntington's studies of Señor Lopez, a jaguar from Paraguay who was the first feline occupant


of the Lion House at the Bronx Zoo. Stone versions of the pair are installed as gateposts at the zoo.
