

We started off with Oren Neugebohr from Auto Electric International – a company that specializes in complete remanufacturing of alternators and starters. It was exciting to see pictures of his facilities and get to know how extremely dedicated he and his company are to running a very specialized and efficient organization.

Next was Jeremy Kaminski – Owner/Technician from FI Motorsports. He and his team work on specialty projects for all sorts of specialty vehicles. There were a wide range of questions asked of both Oren and Jeremy, who were able to provide some in-depth responses. I took advantage of the opportunity to talk with Jeremy about a very interesting article I read in the January - February 2018 Jaguar Journal -Effortlessly Elevated Enclosure by Steve Klonsky. Steve engineered a remote control for the XK8 and XKR convertibles which allows for full remote control of raising and lowering the convertible top using the original factory SmartKey, eliminating the need to have to sit in the car, manually holding your finger on the button for a good 30 seconds. It also allows you to control the small triangular window in the back, which has always puzzled me. I was excited to read this article and more excited to talk with Jeremy about installing this on my XK8 this spring!

I could feel a high level of interest from the club. Thank you, Mike, for enlisting these guys. Looks like you hit a pot of gold. And thanks also, to Bob for providing the projector and other tools to make this presentation such a success.




It's really a fun time for young and old alike.



Friday June 22 - Drive to Mackinaw City, on your own or with loosely organized groups. You can take side trips along the way. The main route will be I-75, covering the 246 miles in about 4:20 with your relatively modern cars. Late-comers could even join us after working on Friday.

Mackinaw City at 8:30 AM and travel to Munising, arriving at 11:00. We'll board the Pictured Rocks Boat Cruise at 12:00 and have lunch on board during the 2 1/2 hour cruise.

Tuesday afternoon we will travel to Paradise and spend the night, checking into the hotel at 5:00 PM. Sunday June 24 - Travel around Paradise visiting the Upper and Lower Tahquamenon Falls and White Fish Point Light House and Maritime Museum.
