





Save the Date - Train Ride to Chicago

There will be another JAGM trip coming up soon, in the off season. That will be a train trip to Chicago on Martin Luther King Weekend in January. It will be Friday Jan 18 thru Monday Jan 21.

The train starts in Pontiac and leaves daily at 10:45 AM, Detroit at 11:30, Ann Arbor at 12:17, Kalamazoo at 2:11 and arrives in Chicago at 3:50 PM with several other stops in between.

The return train leaves Chicago at 12:40 PM, arrives in Kalamazoo at 3:51, Ann Arbor at 5:47, Detroit at 6:46 and Pontiac at 7:45 PM, with several other stops in between. The train fare is \$84 round trip from Pontiac and 10% less for Seniors. There are other train routes around Michigan, but they don't connect with the Pontiac - Chicago route.

Lodging will be near the Miracle Mile in Chicago.



Activities will be made available including Theater, Museums, Shows, Shopping and Sports. This could be a long weekend for some of you working types in the auto industry. If four days doesn't



work out for you, you could come for two or three days.

Watch the December Indicator for final plans and details. You will have to book your own lodging in the Jaguar block and your own train ticket.

British Car Day ~ Presented by the Ontario Triumph Club

"Winchester Cathedral", "I'm a Believer", "I Can't Get No Satisfaction", "Baby You Can Drive My Car": all day long the music played taking us down the memory lane of our lively youth, fabulous tunes, bell bottoms and winkelpickers, AND.................. CARS, our British Cars.

Where? At Bronte Creek Provincial Park, some 25 miles west of Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

Why? To celebrate 35 years of showcasing 1,007 British built beauties: vintage, classic and current: 56 marques including motorcycles and commercial vehicles. The marques ranged from Austin to Westfield, the models from Anglia to Zephyr.

2018 marked many significant anniversaries, including Land Rover (70 yrs), Austin A40 Farina, Austin Healey 100-6, and Sprite (60 yrs), Morgan +8, Jaguar XJ6, and TR6 (50 yrs) and TR8 (40 yrs).

An estimated 8,400 spectators flooded into the Park to ogle our much spritzed, polished, buffed, cosseted, cherished treasures! Some of us drive them and some of you trailer them! This year the Longest Distance Award went to Jim Cox's TR6 driven from

Smithfield KY, some 600 miles.

The beauties were judged according to their class and the Best in Show Award went to a 1937 Triumph Continental owned by Ralph and Kimberly Evans.



Sunday, 16th September started for us at 8:30 am when we left our hotel bound for this hugest Car Show in North America. We were a caravan of some 8 Stags from MI, OH, PA and Ontario.

We were soon in our designated rows boasting our cars with 1,006 others, and the 8,400 spectators started strolling, chatting and admiring our show pieces. Jaguar models ranged from 1995 large


