


We will start the activities at the American Museum of Magic by taking a guided tour of the largest collection of magic artifacts, on public display, in the

would be nice to let Louise Diamond (wheezee@bigtube.net) know what you have so that she can plan for it when setting up the silent auction.


The deadline for signing up for the Concours is about a week before the event on August 18th. Display cars will be accepted at any time, including at the door.

Come and Join the FUN!




Saturday was our busy day. We left the Mackinaw City hotel at 7:30_{AM} to head to the UP. It was overcast but pleasant.

storms back at home. We had a 3 1/2 hour drive to Munising to get to the Pictured Rocks Boat Tour. One car had a mishap with an upper radiator hose. Fortunately, we had an hour cushion and another trip member was there to go out and pick up a universal hose. We boarded the very nice, large, comfortable three level catamaran for our 2 1/4 hour tour. We couldn't have asked for better weather or conditions. The sun

was out. It was warm. The water was smooth as glass. The Edmund Fitzgerald must have been a real wimpy boat to have gone down in that water. We had a very nice pizza and salad luncheon on board which made many other passengers jealous. When we offered them our leftovers, some of the kids really jumped on it. The views of the shoreline were spectacular. The erosion created many cliffs, caves and rock towers, many stained with the local minerals.

The narrations along the way really explained a lot of what we were seeing. I was surprised at the number of lake kayaking schools set up along our route. It was a beautiful day for that activity.

After a short time in Munising, we hit the road for Tahquamenon Falls. On the way, I saw an old Bentley at an ice cream shop. Well, we just had to stop, compare oil leaks, and get some ice cream. The owner invited us to his house the following day which we accepted. We went to the Lower Falls first, walked around and had our Kodak moments. I was surprised to see people and dogs playing in the river and Lower Falls. Then it was off to the Upper Falls and the Brewery located there.

Are you catching a pattern here. No one was playing in the more impressive Upper Falls. They had a significant width and drop for the Midwest. It was another very picturesque walk through the woods to get to the falls. The Brewery was the only place for many miles around that could handle a group our size. We were divided up into several tables which didn't bother us. The food, service and drinks were excellent.

After dinner, many of us went to visit the cottage of Jason and Carol Mattison, some long time JAGM members. They have a

very nice place overlooking Lake Superior in Paradise. Since boys have to have toys, we had to take a look at Jason's Jaguar Mark VII which needs a lot of work and his 20 motorcycles. I thought that was initially a joke, but it wasn't. He actually does ride a different one every day. Some even have license plates. The mosquitoes

in the area were terrible, only to be topped the following day. That was a very long day.

Sunday, we intended to go to Whitefish Point Lighthouse and Shipwreck Museum. En route, we found that they didn't open until the time we had to leave to move on to Sault Ste. Marie. Several of us made the trip there to see the area, the view of the

lake and what was available at the museum. What we saw was over shadowed by all the flying bugs of all types. They didn't care if we had bug spray or not. We came, we saw and we left in 5 minutes.

Back to the hotel to pick up the rest of the group and move on to the Soo. We arrived a bit early and had to wait for our

boat to arrive with our hot luncheon from the other dock. We had a wonderful luncheon on the enclosed lower level. After lunch, we all moved to the open upper level for the improved scenery. We started

out going down river while eating, then turned around and headed up

river to the locks. The very informative narration kept us aware of what was around us. The locks are just one stage with an elevation change of 29 feet. It takes about 12 minutes to fill or empty the locks that we were using. There is a very long, 100 year old, powerhouse that generates electricity from that 29

foot drop. More power to them. We saw the locks, power house, winter ice dams, steel mill, international bridge, swing bridge and historic buildings then back down through another lock.

From there, we went to visit our Bentley friend Brian from the day before. Overall, he had two Jaguar XJS's, almost twins, two Bentley's, a Rolls and even a Corvette. He lived in a very nice apartment above a boat house and he didn't even have a boat. The boathouse had a 29' ceiling so a boat could be raised up out of the water on straps and cables. He did have two kayaks on the massive slings. This was our easy day. We had time to kill., Some went touring around town. Some parked for refreshments. A couple others had their own agenda. On the way back to Mackinaw City, I drove through Saint Ignace, then around Mackinaw City. I drove by the fort, light





house and old Mackinaw icebreaker. We had another great dinner at Audie's and a little get together in our hotel lobby.

Monday, a few of us went through the Mackinaw Bridge Museum in town. I didn't realize that the old museum had burned down in 2007 and so much had been destroyed. It was rebuilt and replaced but not the same. Then it was back home. I traveled I75 to and from Mackinaw City. Overall, I traveled I025 miles in 4 days and averaged 57 mph. We were moving along.

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




