

Kip Mrkva Wrap-Up



We had a great member turnout for the July meeting speaker, *Certified Financial Planner* **Kip Mrkva**.

Kip's presentation demonstrated his use of the free daily charts provided

at www.StockCharts.com. He studies technical indicators such as the RSI (relative strength index) and the 50 Day Moving average to identify when a stock was "safe" to buy and also when it was time to sell and "go away". Members suggested several familiar stocks and Kip questioned the audience whether they should buy it or not, based on the tables he showed from the website. He also introduced a newer family of stocks called ETF's (Exchange Traded Funds) which represent a basket of stocks similar to a mutual fund but traded with the liquidity of a regular stock.

Kip invited members to visit his office during regular trading hours, to see him trade in real time. If interested, or you have any investment questions, simply give Kip a call at 248.626.2000 x116.

Ok. show time!





"While I Am At It", Rod Lindoo Story continues

Where's that engine?: part 4

It took a while, 6 months but I finally got it back from Auto Machine in St Charles, Illinois. Actually it worked out perfectly since I just finished up painting the front end and installing a few things.

I found some interesting things out thru all this. One of my connecting rods had been replaced before I bought the car. I got it when it was 8 years old! It was also 20 grams heavier than the other rods. Maybe it will run smother now that the engine was balanced.

The machine shop bores out the piston sleeves and installs new ones on all Jag engines. If you look at the picture, you can see cooling slots in the top of the block with the sleeve removed. These slots get choked with crud and wont cool the top of the head very well causing your pistons to fail. Which was probably what happened with my piston

knock.. Boiling out the block doesn't clean this stuff out well enough.

When I took the oil filter housing off, there was a loose part inside. Turns out it was the bypass valve that would open if your filter got plugged. So my oil was actually bypassing the filter some and going out this open hole back into the engine. I wonder how long that's been going on? I think its probably wise to check that every time I replace the filter now. I found a few other people on the internet that have had the same problem.

I was going to drop the motor in from the top this time but had trouble fitting the lift where I needed it to go so it went back in thru the bottom. I think it was easier to do that way. Just slide it under and pull it straight up.

Time to put everything else together. Stayed tuned for part 5.






Cooling grooves at the top of cylinder with the sleeve removed.

Pulled up and sitting in place.




