


Train Trip to Chicago - Friday 1/18 to Monday 1/21 2019

The details of the trip are slowly coming together and with a lot of difficulties.

Amtrak Train Service:

We will be taking the Amtrak Wolverine Service # 353 to Chicago. That service starts in Pontiac, moves through Detroit and west to Battle Creek and to Chicago.

You can see all the stops and station times on the documents that will be attached to the electronic Indicator.

The train leaves Pontiac at 10:00 AM, Detroit at 10:45, Ann Arbor at 11:32, Kalamazoo at 1:31 and arrives at Chicago Union Station at 3:05 PM.

The return will be on the Wolverine Service # 352. The train leaves Chicago Union Station at 1:25 PM, Arrives at Kalamazoo at 4:32, Ann Arbor at 6:34, Detroit at 7:33 and Pontiac at 8:32 PM.

You will have to book your own train tickets on line. The website is www.amtrak.com/home. html. I stopped into the Pontiac train station to check things out and ask a few questions, but there is no one there to discuss train travel at all.

The cost of round trip train travel is about \$100 per person, about the same cost of gas for the round trip in your car. There are a few economy rates left, getting in under \$100 from the end of the line in Pontiac. Seniors over 65 get 10% or so reduced rates. The Amtrak website is not very straight forward. Prepare for a little bit of frustration.

There are other trains running around Michigan. They will not meet up with our Wolverine Service and their times are significantly different. There is a cafe on board with sandwiches, snacks and beverages but feel free to bring your own. There is Wifi onboard. I will board in Pontiac and will see if we can get a bunch of seats saved for the others who will board later. If you can't make it for Friday thru Monday, you can book just the days that you can travel.

Lodging

We will be staying at the **Hilton Garden Inn**, 10 E. Grand Ave, Chicago, on the corner of Grand and State Streets and next to the Grand Station. It is just three blocks to the Magnificent Mile known for fine shopping and historic buildings. I was not able to establish a block of rooms without paying for them myself. A IK room is about \$88 per night and 2Q is about \$97. Tax and fees adds about \$15 to \$18 per night. The hotel has a great location and very good customer ratings. **You need to call and make your own reservations.** A phone number for central reservations is 855-850-0554.

I am still trying to figure out the easiest way to travel between Union Station and our Hotel. I will have a plan before we get there. You may want to make sure that you have an Uber and/or Lyft account ready to go before we get there. We may have activities together and we may all go our separate directions. I will look into the Theater and Sports schedules and have more info for you later.

Please let me know once you have booked your hotel room and bought your train ticket. Let me know what train station you will be boarding and departing. I will establish a texting group so we can all stay informed even while moving.



A big **THANK YOU** to all who contributed!!!















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
