

March 2024 Valve Cover Racing ("VCR") Clinic

With nippy temps and a bit of snow still lingering, eleven people attended the VCR clinic at Lee Jacobsen's garage—three from JAGM and the balance from the MG clubs.

Two new VCRs were built during the clinic. Jeremy Brown (an MG guy) built a British Green VCR using a valve cover from a 1951 MG TD. He used push scooter wheels with his stock (provided by Lee) chassis. After some tinkering and tweaking his car was tracking straight. After weight was added to just under the 12-pound limit (for the under 12-pound class), and the car had run down the track a good number of times, his car was

done for the day.

A second VCR was built by the author using Lee's stock chassis, shopping cart wheels, and a valve cover of sorts that Lee had lying around his shop. In less than 30 minutes the car was assembled and tested for tractability. Amazingly it tracked quite true from the start, with only a slight adjustment required. Once running true, some weight was added so that the car weighed in at 11.8 pounds.

timer has a flashing yellow light, which after a few seconds stops blinking and remains solidly lit. Then within two to ten seconds (it varies to make things more interesting), a larger white light is lit. That signals that the race has commenced. So now the speed of the




operator in releasing his or her car is also part of the race. So a tad slower car that tracks straight with a better start can be more competitive. Drag racing starts have come to VCR.
