

The 24 Hours of Le Mans.

attending the Le Mans Classic, which is normally run every 2 years, and is a vintage version of the original 24 hour race.

2023 is the centenary of the 24 Hours of Le Mans! Originally known as Grand Prix de Vitesse et d'Endurance, there are so many stories of heroes winning and losing (their lives) that I am drawn to the place just to imbibe the racing atmosphere and be part of the daredevil thrills and spills as a spectator, along with thousands of other enthusiasts.

The Le Mans Classic, for me, is a much better spectator event than the annual 24 Heures du Mans. If I can tempt you to go racing in France, then this is the one

for you. It is not a corporate event as the 24 hour race and is a little more grass roots. For example, spectators are allowed in the paddocks, and you can chat with the racers and mechanics while they work on some impressive classic machinery.

I have participated in the Le Mans 24 Classic many times since its inception in 2002. It's basically a retrospective of the 24 Hours of Le Mans, by running for 24 hours from 4pm Saturday, until 4pm Sunday, with cars that previously ran at Le Mans 24 hours, broken into 6 eras (2 hour heats) with the cars' ages ranging from 1923 to 1979.

The attraction is made complete using the full 13.65 km, 24 hour circuit, involving the conversion of country public roads for the event. Only the classic and modern Le Mans 24 hour events use this full circuit.

Now to the secondary attraction of the event. The spectators' vehicles and club displays are amazing. All rope and Scandinavia. You can see exotic and valuable vehicles parked in the spectator lots as regular cars. Quite a moving museum collection. Bentley was the featured margue at one of the events; there were rows of Bentley Blowers, not just one or two. If you had put a deposit down on a new Bentley Continental GT, the dealer would let you take his ex Le Mans 1930 Bentley 4.5L Blower around the track!

For me, I cannot escape the mystique and grandeur of My connecting Jaguar thread is that over the years, I have had the opportunity to visit and run the "practice" laps at Le Mans in classic British cars. My cousin and I normally meet in England and run to Le Mans with his friends in a variety of right-hand drive performance cars. I have ridden alongside AC Cobras, Lotus, Jaguars, MG's and Triumphs in our group. Not to mention Porsches, Mercedes and some big bikes.

> My personal steeds have included Jaguars and Sunbeam (Tiger). For the last visit I made, just before COVID hit, I borrowed a 1996 XJS V12 convertible and had a blast driving top down across France from Cherbourg to Le Mans and then running the pre-race practice laps (definitely NOT a parade!). The first Northville Cars and Coffee was a big hit – in fact, much bigger than we at JAGM or the organizers in Northville expected. The weather was clear and sunny (if a bit cold early!) and the great variety of cars and trucks made for excellent and interesting viewing.

Our club had reserved a space for 10 cars, and we ended up with a total of 13. We had a great spot – right up front near the entrance – and were able to park almost all of our cars together. The event was

expected to draw about 400 cars total; it appeared that the actual number was at least 750! The displayed cars spilled over into at least one other nearby lot. Fresh Thyme Market in Farmington provided coffee and pastries. The huge attendance made it difficult for them to keep up with demand, but they made a

gallant attempt, sending out for reinforcements more than once! They dispensed about 1000 cups of coffee and 500 excellent pastries.
