In Our Garage—My XJ8L Air Suspension Replacement Project

During the early summer of 2022, my 2005 XJ8L developed an air suspension issue. Intermittently, an Air Suspension Fault light would show on the dashboard display.

During start-up, the XJ undergoes a two-minute test cycle to determine if the "proper" ride height has been obtained based on three sensors and the system's settings. If it does not obtain the correct ride height, an Air System Fault is displayed. However, when the air system fault light was displayed, my car ride height continued to be good and the ride quality also seemed good. Not happy with this light, the hunt for the issue began. After a trip to the shop did not find an issue with the pump or any air leakage, the problem was assumed to be with the ride sensors.

My research turned up that an air suspension fault is not uncommon for XJ8s. Frequently the dash

light was just ignored if nothing seemed wrong. So over time, I developed a strategy to ignore the fault as long as the ride quality, or observed ride height, seem OK. But if either became an issue I would just replace the air suspension with a coil-over kit. My perspective was that fixing air suspension issues over time would be

somewhat like a game of whack-a-mole. Fix one issue, only to find yet another occurring over time. And the coil-over ride quality was reportedly not much stiffer than that of the air suspension.

During the first two months of winter storage, the suspension began to sag in the rear. So an undetectable leak must have turned into a noticeable leak with the onset of colder temperatures. The discussions on the various forums mentioned this happening.

So I started looking for a service provider to install a coil-over kit. There are several manufacturers of these kits, such as Arnott, Dorman, and StrutMasters. The online forums seemed to favor Arnott because of their construction and ride quality.

I contacted five service providers in total. They were Steve's European Automotive (Waterford), Action One Automotive (Rochester), The Auto Doctor European (Southfield), Motor City Euro Repairs (Farmington), and Cooks' Automotive (South Lyon). I ended up getting three quotes, one each from Steve's, Action One, and Cook's. All three were using an Arnott coil-over kit. The lowest price was from Steve's at \$2,947, with Cook's next at \$8 more and Action One slightly more.

I went with Cook's Automotive since they are local, their price was nominally the same as the lowest quoted price, and I have six years of experience with them on the X-Type and now on the XJ8L.

I scheduled the work and dropped the car off on Monday morning and picked it up Tuesday after-

noon, following an alignment.
The ride quality on my short trip home over two sets of railroad crossings was perhaps a smidgen stiffer, and the car sits perhaps an inch taller, but the car still rides very nice.

I will be keenly interested in getting back on the road in late April to break in the new suspension. I will not miss that irritating dash light one bit.

Arnott does have a video (on YouTube) demonstrating the replacement of front and rear air shock on an XJ8 with their coil-overs, for those who want to tackle the work themselves and reduce the cost by perhaps one-third. By one customer's review, the final, and perhaps the most difficult step, was the removal of the rear seat back to gain access to the control module, where the electronic termination kit gets installed.
