

JAGM lived up to our reputation for putting on a high quality and entertaining Concours. Some members and out of town visitors stayed in Auburn Hills in the very nice Springhill Suites Inn. Our Friday welcoming party was held in the hotel lobby, where food,

friends, fellowship and accommodations were great.

The Concours itself was held at Olde World Canterbury Village in Lake Orion. It was a great place for a car show, and several are hosted there every year. The cars were spread throughout the Village, some on grass -- some on brick paver sidewalks. There was plenty of room around the cars and the placements encouraged everyone to roam around the Village to see the sights and visit the shops. The Pub and Cider Mill had our food and beverage needs covered for the day.

Saturday began with high humidity, lasting until noon. A large Hospitality Tent was the savior of the morning. As people checked in, they wandered over to pack their own goodie bags from both new and recycled merchandise. All cars were arranged in basic groups, regardless of the specific class or division they had entered. We had quite a range in years and models in some of the groups. Before long the sun came out and judging was completed in sunshine. As usual, judging was tough but fair and I think everyone felt the results were well justified.

The Awards Banquet was held on-site Saturday evening in a beautiful room and with great food service. A Silent Auction very nicely complemented the day. We presented a slide show of all the cars on the field, along with the owner's name and score, so you felt like you were still at the show. Commemorative wine glasses, with our Concours dash plaque etched into the side, were given as thank

you mementoes to all workers and guests. I still have some left over. They are available for \$5 each. Just contact Bob.

The Judging Score Sheets have already been returned to the participants. Score Sheets provide a great check list that can be used to improve the vehicle, regardless of your future intentions. We did have some special awards to present: Most Improved went to Rod Lindoo with his 1970 E-Type coupe. The Murphy's Law Award went to Bob and Kathy Reid, whose tow vehicle had problems on the way to the Concours, forcing them to return home without showing their 1961 E-Type roadster. They did return for the banquet. The Prince of Darkness Award went to Marianna Staples and her beautiful 1960 Mark IX, because the headlights stopped functioning. There were a couple of runner's up awards: Mattie Majors had to replace the battery on her 1969 E-Type 2+2 coupe, before she could come to do her job as concours judge. Rod Lindoo's alternator stopped functioning at the event. Later, he jump started his car, and it ran half way home, ending up on a tow truck the rest of the way. After switching the alternator with a spare, everything was fine and ready to go. We all take these little mishaps as a part of owning a classic vehicle. It just adds a little character to us and the experience.


