A Story of Integrity and Beauty Conrad Foster and His 1966 E-Type

I have a deep and long-term love of this car; for the significance of the E-Type to the automotive world and its importance in the history of the Jaguar marque, and also as a beautiful icon of engineering and artistic design. Since I've owned this car for almost 35 years, I'll share a little of the history. There were two previous owners, the first Mr. T. Durakis, of Springfield, Ohio (outside of Cleveland) owned the car wife Norma for about 15 minutes we decided it was a from new through the 1970s, and R. Kazanowski of Wolverine Lake, Michigan, whom I purchased the car

from in November of 1987. Mr. Durakis remained a bachelor his whole life, and in fact when he purchased the car he lived with his parents. He died in 2014.

There is a true story and one of life's important lessons that I have shared with my sons and others related to my purchase of this

car. The lesson involves our integrity, and the fact that one's integrity follows them wherever they go, and for their whole life. When I answered the tiny two-line classified ad in the Sunday Detroit News "Sports and Imported Car" category in November of 1987, I had never looked at an E-Type and in fact was actively in the market for a Ferrari; either an early BB512 or a 365GTC4.

I had to fly to San Diego for a west coast business trip that afternoon, so when I saw that tiny ad I called Mr. Kazanowski at 6:30 am, apologized if I had woken him up, and asked if I could stop by his house early to take a look and test drive the car before I had to head to the airport. He agreed and I arrived at his house at approximately 7:15 am. He accompanied me while we took the car on a short drive around Wolverine

Lake. We parked the car in his driveway, and I told him I needed to speak to my wife further about the car to make a decision. In fact, it was the first time I had looked at, sat in, or driven an E-Type in my life and never had considered purchasing one.

After sitting in his driveway and conferring with my beautiful car, and about 8:00 a.m. I knocked on Mr. Kazanowski's door and told him what I was going to

> offer him for the car, which was \$250 less than he was asking. After a moment he accepted my offer. He scribbled a handwritten purchase agreement on a torn out lined piece of notebook paper, and I told him I would give him a \$100 deposit to hold the car for the week and would pay him the balance due by Friday when I returned from the west coast.



I called him Thursday night

from a pay phone in the airport after my plane landed to confirm that I would meet him Friday morning at 9 a.m. to give him a check for the balance due. We could then go to the Secretary of State to sign over the title and transfer ownership. He paused for a moment on the phone and said "I've gone through hell this week with my wife over your offer with this car. You were the first one to answer my ad, and after you left my house I had 83 phone calls on Sunday about the car, and people offering me thousands of

dollars more than I agreed to accept from you, over the phone sight unseen, but I want you to know I have honored your \$100 deposit and I held the car for

you. So PLEASE meet me in the White Castle parking lot in Canton at 9 a.m. If you don't show up, I've got people lined up to buy this car."

In my two 2" binders of history and service records, I still have the original classified ad and the torn piece of notebook paper that served as the Purchase Agreement, and I've told my sons and others this story many times as an example of integrity and how important in life it is.

When I first purchased the car, it had an oil leak, and I brought it to Forrest Black in 1988, who owned a service shop, Sports and Imported Car Service, on Stadium Boulevard in Ann Arbor. He determined that the car needed to have the cylinders bored, and the brakes refurbished. I ordered a new matched set of pistons from England through Falvey Motors of Troy, the local Jaguar distributor at the time. Forrest was an outstanding Jaguar mechanic but unfortunately his shop relocated and he died in 2008.

After owning the car for 25 years and doing little else but routine oil changes and refurbishing the brakes, rarely driving it, and storing it in a heated garage with a cover over it, I determined that I was going to have the car restored in 2013. I first had Matt Nold install a Conrad Foster

new Bell stainless exhaust system and do some additional mechanical work in 2013 and 2014.

In 2015 I undertook what turned out to be a six-year comprehensive engine-out mechanical and cosmetic restoration of the car through Muncie Imports of Muncie Indiana. I have tried to focus on originality. The engine block, chassis, radiator, transmission, even the clutch is original and refurbished. There are just a couple of mechanical upgrades, such as an auxiliary electric engine cooling fan and electronic ignition installed for reliability, but I have the original parts. Every year Muncie Imports dispatched their own enclosed trailer to my house in Plymouth to pick up the car in November and would return it to me the following May. This continued every year from 2015 to late March of 2020 when the restoration was completed. I had been in contact with both previous owners to discuss the history of the car through their eyes and experience. I was very lucky that the car had been well kept and loved by its previous owners.

My plans are to continue driving and enjoying this car, and I hope one day one my sons will share the same love of its beauty, and history that I have.


teresting cars by a person who is, like many of us, a certified car nut. Second, that certified individual is a member of JAGM, Pat Nowak.


If you're looking for a quick and entertaining read as we head into the Jaguar off-season, I can highly rec-
