Chrysler Museum Tour

The recent snow fall put a little doubt in people's minds and added a bit to the travel time. Thirteen people showed up with the Jaguar Car Club. There were also several other car clubs represented.

We had a good time looking through the displays spread over 3 floors, reminiscing about the past and the changes that have occurred. Everyone had a favorite car or a special feeling for one.

I liked the two Challengers on display. They really looked timeless and still sharp. The plum crazy color on one and lots of chrome won't become mainstream again until who knows when.

After the Museum, we retired to the Red Ox near Oakland University for lunch. That was a back-up location because the first choice was filled up with



other groups, probably from the Museum.

Some little picked up tidbits:

There were 65 Turbine Cars built in the mid 60's. After the program ended all but 9 cars were destroyed. Those were left to museums. Two of those museums have closed and those two cars are now in private collections. The Chrysler Heritage had 3 Turbine cars, all running. One was mostly a museum stationary display, one was a traveling display and a spare. Jay Leno helped run a fund raiser for the Chrysler Museum a year ago and said that he would like a Turbine car so the Chrysler Heritage sold him the spare for one million dollars. The fund raiser and car sale kept the museum going for the past year.



There is a WW2 Jeep on display in a setting from the War. The vehicle had a military unit designation and location marked on the front bumper as Berlin. During the days of Daimler Benz & Chrysler, the front bumper was wrapped with rope so that Berlin was not visible.



There is a WW2 tank engine on display. It was actually five V8 car engine blocks put together to form one big engine. The engine was found in South America and was restricted from coming into the USA, because it was considered war material. It needed special approval and had to be declared a historical item to be able to enter the country.

Recent weekends when the Museum was open, they had about 100 people per day visiting. During the final weekends, the attendance was closer to and maybe exceeding 600 per day.

The Chrysler Museum is now closed for good. There were about 75 cars on display and another 125 in storage elsewhere. All 200 cars will remain in the Chrysler Heritage and be used for special displays at different events and at FCA facilities.

The building will be turned into office space. If you missed it, it is your loss. Someday, tell your kids or grand kids that it used to exist.


