
Looking into 2021, it's hard to guess what it will be like for all of us and the country, but it's important to

Remembering Rosie the Riveter

Rosie the Riveters is a great organization, very few of the original Rosies remain. What is a Rosie? Briefly they are the women of WWII who stepped up and worked in the factories, building aircraft for the war effort, on the home front as many of the men were in short supply, fighting overseas.



Many folk are support folk for the Rosies, myself included. Two Rosies were recently honored, Helen Kushnir and Marjorie Gifford, a Rose garden estab-

lished in their names at the Dearborn Historical Museum. I had hoped to be at the ceremony. Unfortunately, work interfered, but I met with Rosie Helen early in the AM at her home and gave her a 'custom' face shield to be worn at the event, so all could see her smile!......} On the top of it is written......

"ROSIE HELEN Original Version!" in Red, White, and Blue decals.

She loves it, and I hope to make more of them for the rest of the Rosies...a work in progress...Go Rosies!

As an aside, my Mom (Kate) was a Rosie at the Willow Run plant, building B-24 bombers along with 40,000 plus others. She happened to be a relief person, expert in 15 different operations, moving from job to job, giving others a ten minute break while the plant kept running...some sections of it never stopped.

My Mom had many stories about the operations, but one was unique. She and a girlfriend would hide at

the rear of one of the bombers at the end of a change-over to watch the six man military guard remove the 'top secret' Norden bombsights from the aircraft. "Mom" I would ask, "what's so special about watching a bombsight being removed?" "Son" she replied, "someday you will understand. It was not the

bombsight that was interesting. For us, our focus was on the six men carrying it!" Hmmm..... Later, she bought at an auction, in the 1950s, 3 Norden bombsights, \$10 each, still in the crates, with aircraft logs, for each of us kids. I donated two of them back in the early 80s to the newly formed Yankee Air Force, they are now in the B-25 and B-17 aircraft.

I happen to have a 1947 Packard 7 passenger sedan, and other classic old cars. Over the years, I would drive Helen, Marjorie, and other Rosies in numerous parades,

where many songs were sung, many stories were told. Years ago, we would have seven original Rosies in the Packard, doing parades. Now, it's 3 or 4, or just

Helen in the Jaguar XKE, (her favorite car!) As I was saying, many stories were told.

One favorite story was told by the Rosie that helped issue payroll at Willow Run."Long lines each week would form up to a very secure, elevated room (actually a vault) at the plant. The

vault) at the plant. The cement steps became very worn leading up to that room, which contained the payroll, all in coin. Each worker got an average of \$30 per week in cash. That is over a million dollars, 1940s dollars, per week. I was one of those that handed out the money. We were the most liked, and safest, Rosies on earth!"

Helen Kushnir was unique in that, like Marjorie, she was an actual 'riveter.' A rivet is a fastener that holds the skin of the aircraft to the frame. She mentioned that, for safety reasons, the plant where she worked

had special areas where they would do the riveting. She worked on Hellcats, the Navy dive bombers, at a massive plant located at the intersection of Ford and Wyoming, now pretty much long gone.

Rosies worked at plants all over the country, and, with their help, the USA and allies emerged triumphant in WWII. The Rosies will never be forgotten, always remembered, part of America's proud heritage. Thank you once again Rosies!
