



Motor Muster and Historic Base Ball Match

On **Saturday, June 20**, JAGM will have an informal

gathering at Greenfield Village, featuring the Village's annual Motor Muster car show and an 1867 Base Ball match.

The Motor Muster, which runs both Saturday and Sunday, fea-

tures cars, trucks and military vehicles from 1933 to 1978. Typically there are hundreds of vehicles, parked and driving all around the Village from 9:30 am to 9 pm. The historic base ball (it was two words back then) match will be played with the rules and equipment (or lack thereof) from 1867; many things are the same, but many are noticeably different, such as the underhand pitching and bare-handed catching. The match starts at 1:30 pm and takes about 2 hours. I expect to be playing, but I'll have plenty of time dur-

ing the match to visit and sign autographs (no charge

for JAGM members!).

We could plan to have dinner at one of the Village restaurants or off-site.

Come to the Village anytime and spend as long as you like. Admis-

sion: non-members is \$28 adult, \$25.25 senior (62+),

\$21 youth (5-11), and children 4 and under free. Parking is \$6. Note: Check out getting a membership if you think you'll visit the Henry Ford again within a vear.

The first confirmed COVID-19 case in an inanimate being has been discovered. A 1959 Jaguar XK150, stored in an antique car storage facility near Seattle, was diagnosed with the virus after exhibiting some of the typical symptoms (overheating, backfiring and respiratory obstruction).

On behalf of Homes For Our Troops (HFOT), our Veterans and their families, **thank you** for partnering with us in "building homes and rebuilding lives." "This opportunity will be a huge blessing to my family," Matthew says, "and one I could use to better myself as well as my community. I believe in paying it forward and would use my time to teach, volunteer, and set an example for others to follow." Matthew recently joined the HFOT family of Veterans and is currently in our land search process.
