A relatively light field of twelve cars was judged in the Championship or Driven classes. Those included visiting entrants from Ohio, Wisconsin and Virginia. One of the visitors was John Boswell, president of JCNA, who also stepped in to assist with judging. These were joined by 9 cars in the Display class.

Outside activity broke up around 3:30 and everyone moved inside for the presentation of awards, including the following special awards:

- Most Improved went to Bob Klemmer. His E-Type's score improved by 2.84 points from 2021 to 2022.
- **Murphy's Law** went to **Marco Sperduti**, who contracted COVID-19 two days before the concours.

# Lap the Lake 2023 (Lake Michigan) May 14-19, 2023

Rambler Rallies runs rallies around many parts of the country. 2023 is the third year of Lap the Lake, their original rally.

This lap of Lake Michigan, starting in Evanston, IL, covers over 1,000 miles of 2 lane scenic highways, with private car museum tours, national parks, evening main street festivals, drag strips, harbor towns, and more along the way! Each day's drive will take place along a predetermined route, actual driving time will range from 3-4 hours each day depending on the leg.

They arrange group rates at several hotels in each host city. The target room rate is \$120-150 each night. You are responsible for making your own reservations! You do not have to stay at one of the preselected hotels.

Entry is per team (Vehicle); cost is \$299, regardless of the number of passengers. The first 15 to sign up pay only \$199. One Entry Covers: Entry fee for 1 vehicle, 2 shirts, swag bag, daily events (drag strip fees, etc.),

support vehicle costs, vehicle decals, tickets to events & parties and administration fees. It does not include hotel expenses, fuel, national park fees (if any), food & beverage.

The best car to drive is the one you have! All safe and road legal cars are allowed to enter the rally. While they encourage you to participate with your classic, they won't turn away more modern whips.

The 2023 rally includes stops at Sheboygan, WI, Escanaba, Charlevoix, Ludington, and St. Joe/Benton Harbor.

Saturday, September 10 was a wonderful day for a Road Trip. Moderate temperatures and partly overcast. A small group of us started out at another nice Cracker Barrel Breakfast.

We next gathered up

at the National Museum of the Great Lakes in Toledo. Having never been there, I did not really know what to expect. All of us were really surprised at how much we liked the museum. The


museum building very nicely told of the development of Great Lakes Shipping and the Great Lakes Ships with many different displays and dioramas. Watching the clock, we moved to the outdoor displays of a lake tugboat and the largest ore carrier ever on the great lakes. That ore carrier was huge at about 750 feet long. Each of the holds below could swallow up a full-size basketball court. The front structure held the naviga-

tion crew and cargo handlers with a few added guest



cabins. The rear structure held the mechanical crew, ships mess and all the mechanical and engineering spaces. Halfway down the open deck there were two putting greens. We never found out if they were real from when the ship was sailing or just now for display. The orecarrier's usual route

was between Duluth and Cleveland. That would take about 2 1/2 days covering over 1000 miles while traveling at about 20 knots. Once onboard, the 29-person crew was there for about 3 months at a time.



It had a crew of about 11 powerplant pollution and below water level.






