






Car Show!

Sunday, May 22, 2016 an enthusiastic group of JAGM members enjoyed a day of HISTORY, ENTERTAINMENT and ELEGANCE.

The day broke bright, blue, clear and warm, the perfect backdrop to a JAGM drive in Mid-Michigan, allowing for a day long pleasant and memorable experience.

HISTORY: First up was the "R.E. Olds Transportation Museum" in downtown Lansing.



Favored with a guided tour by volunteers Dave and Rick, retired Olds engineers and lifelong residents of the Lansing area, we saw and heard the Oldsmobile story. From the first stationary engine to the curved dash Oldsmobile and on to the last example of the



marque we saw examples of Oldsmobile throughout the years. Amongst the many pre-war (WW II) and post war exhibits were artifacts

from the Oldsmobile home, the REO years (including the first REO Speedwagon and the story behind the naming of the rock group R.E.O. Speedwagon),

original 1950's black and white TV commercials (running on an old Zenith console





TV), war production items and a replica of the famous Fisher Body coach and trademark (handmade by Oldsmobile craftsmen).
